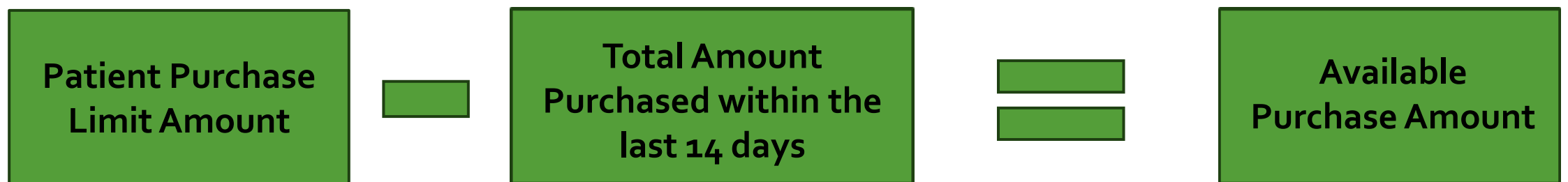




Medical Cannabis Limits, Explained



Ex: buy 1g pre-roll subtract 1g	Ex: buy 100mg edible (0.1x3.33) +1g RSO (1x2.66) subtract 2.99g
Ex: buy 1g pre-roll +100mg edible (0.1x3.33) subtract 1.33g	Ex: buy eighth flower (3.5g), +100mg edible (0.1x3.33), +1g THC oil (1x2.66) subtract 6.49g

What is a typical Patient Purchase Limit Amount equal to?



If a patient has the typical Patient Purchase Limit Amount, they can buy 2.5 ounces of flower (or pre-rolls). 2.5 oz is equal to **70.87 grams of flower**, or 70 pre-rolls (1 gram each) over 14 days.

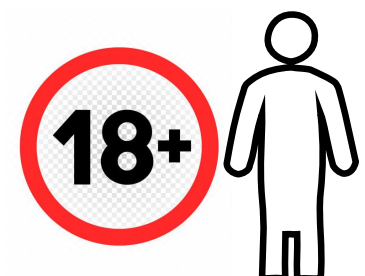


The typical Patient Purchase Limit Amount (2.5 oz flower) equals **21,300mg of THC in edibles or beverages**. 21,300mg is equal to 213 packages with 100mg THC.



The typical Patient Purchase Limit Amount (2.5 oz flower) equals **26.6 grams of THC in vapes or concentrates**. 26.6g is equal to about 27 vapes of 1 gram.

Minor qualifying patients are limited to only cannabis-infused products.

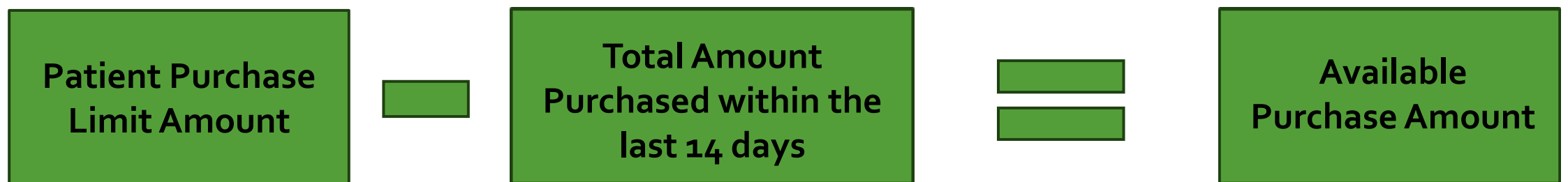

Medical Cannabis Limits, Explained



The Patient Purchase Limit Amount is typically 2.5 ounces of cannabis flower. The current Available Purchase Amount is calculated as the Patient Purchase Limit Amount minus the Total Amount Purchased within the last 14 days. Limit amounts can be increased by a Health Care Provider with a [waiver for increased allotment](#).

THERE IS JUST ONE LIMIT, AND IT HAS NOT CHANGED: the Total Amount Purchased includes all flower, pre-rolls, vapes, edibles, oils, and all cannabis products. For flower, the weight of flower deducts from the limit (EX: 1g pre-roll deducts 1g from the limit). Purchases of cannabis-infused products and concentrates count as the pre-mixed weight of flower used to make the product.

The relationship between product types are shown below.

3.327 g of flower equals

1,000 mg of THC edibles

1.25 g of THC concentrates

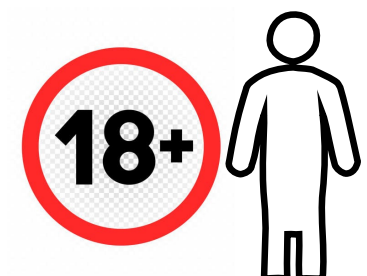


Edibles

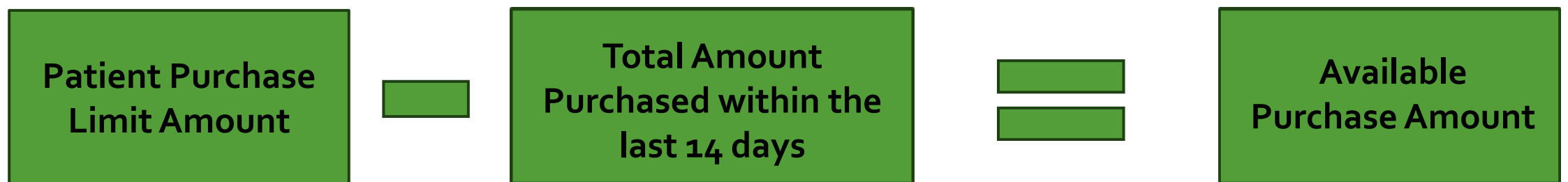

Medical Cannabis Limits: Conversion Tables



1 ounce = 28.35 grams	1 gram of THC concentrate = 2.66g of flower
One eighth oz = 3.5 grams	100 milligrams of THC edibles = 0.33g flower
Typical Patient Limit: 2.5 ounces = 70.87 grams	Typical Patient Limit: 2.5 ounces flower = 26.6g concentrate or 21,300mg edibles

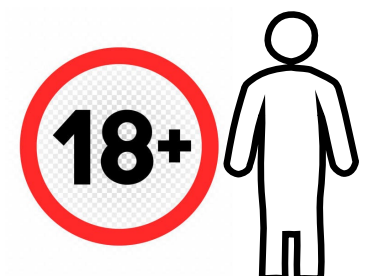


The Patient Purchase Limit is typically 2.5 ounces of cannabis flower. **THERE IS JUST ONE LIMIT, AND IT HAS NOT CHANGED.** The current Available to Purchase Amount is calculated as the Patient Purchase Limit Amount minus the Total Amount Purchased within the last 14 days. Limit amounts can be adjusted by a Health Care Provider by submitting a [waiver for increased allotment](#).

All flower, pre-rolls, vapes, edibles, oils, and all cannabis products get counted against the one limit. For flower, the weight of flower deducts from the limit (EX: 1g pre-roll deducts 1g from the limit). Purchases of cannabis-infused products and concentrates count as the pre-mixed weight of flower used to make the product.

The tables above show how much could be purchased. If a patient buys concentrates and edibles, all get deducted from the one limit.
